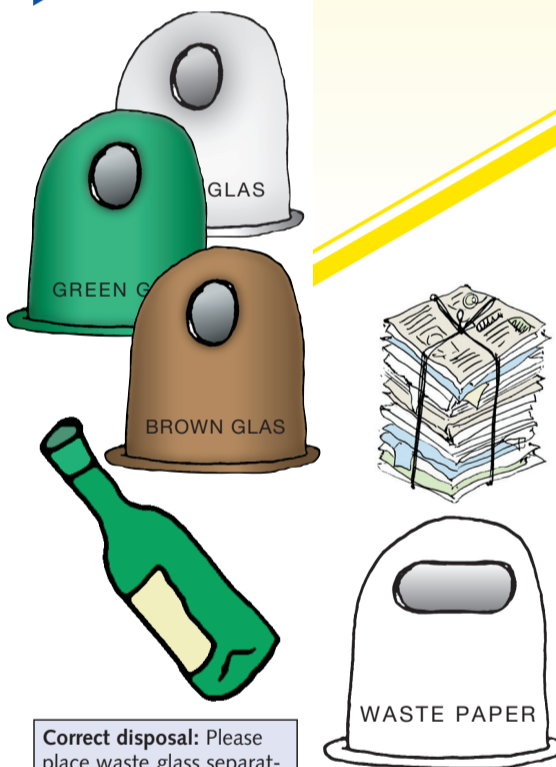

**This includes e.g.:**  
Ash and sweepings  
Vacuum cleaner bags  
Cigarette waste  
Nappies and sanitary towels  
Used paper hankies  
Strongly contaminated papers and packaging  
Photos and negatives  
Disposal products such as e.g. lighters, ballpoint pens, disposal razors  
Defective consumer goods such as e.g. children's toys, bulbs, writing utensils, glasses, mirrors  
LPs, music and video cassettes  
Waste from conversion and renovation work such as e.g. wallpaper waste, painter's foil, waste cables, insulating polystyrene, hard paints  
Waste from handicraft work such as leather and rubber waste  
Used cleaning cloths  
Old pots, pans and crockery  
Disposable syringes (in solid containers)  
Cooked leftovers of food especially fish, meat and bones  
Cheese rind and cold meat and sausage skin  
Cooking oils and fats  
Inorganic animal straw  
Excrement from pets (dogs, cats)



**Correct disposal:** Please place waste glass separated according to colours in the containers for white glass, green glass and brown glass. Different coloured glass must not be mixed with green glass. Please place tops and lids in the yellow sack.

**Correct disposal:**  
a) Waste paper collections by organisations. Please see the waste collection calendar for the dates.  
b) Waste paper containers.

**Attention!**  
**Waste glass does not include e.g.:**  
Window glass  
Mirrors  
Ceramic  
Porcelain  
Clay bottles  
Bulbs  
Fluorescent tubes

**Important information:**  
Glass containers may only be used workdays from 7:00 am to 7 pm. It is not permitted to place waste glass and other waste next to the containers.

**Attention!**  
**Waste paper does not include e.g.:**  
Wallpaper  
Paper hankies  
Juice and milk cartons  
Photos  
Carbon paper  
Non-carbon paper  
Dirty papers

**Important information:**  
The containers may only be used workdays from 7:00 am to 7 pm. It is not permitted to place waste paper, cartons and other waste next to the containers.

**Correct disposal:**  
The yellow sack. Pick-up every 2 weeks together with the residual waste bin. Please see the waste collection calendar for the telephone number in case you have any questions and complaints.

**Important information:**  
Not everything which bears a "Grüne Punkt" [Green spot] is suitable for the yellow sack: The following should not be placed in the sack:  
a) Packaging made of glass (cf. column 1)  
b) Packaging made of paper and cardboard (cf. column 2)  
Wrongly filled sacks or sacks containing waste which is not packaging or residual waste will not be collected.  
Please place the packaging in the sacks without and leftover contents.



**Correct disposal**  
a) Composting on own compost pile.  
b) Use of the compost container, emptied every 2 weeks. Please see the waste collection calendar for the dates.

**Attention!**  
**This does not include e.g.**  
Fish and meat leftovers  
Bones  
Cheese rind and cold meat and sausage skin  
Oils and fats  
Animal excrement  
Animal carcasses  
Nappies  
Sweepings  
Plastic bags

**Important information:**  
Please place the kitchen waste without plastic bags in the compost container. In order to avoid smells kitchen waste can be wrapped in newspaper or in paper bags.



**Correct disposal:**  
Pick-up by order. If required request using the bulky waste card (pink).

**Attention!**  
**Bulky waste does not include e.g.:**  
Objects from construction and conversion work  
Doors and windows  
Radiators  
Sanitary ceramic and tiles  
Bathtubs and boilers  
Wallpaper waste  
Fences  
Mirrors and glass  
Tyres and car parts  
Waste in sacks and cartons  
Other residual waste (cf. column 7)  
Defective small electrical appliances such as e.g. toaster, hairdryer, razor, radio, alarm clocks (cf. column 8)

**Correct disposal:**  
These can be handed in at the waste depots.



**Correct disposal:**  
a) Hand-over to the mobile and stationary special waste collection. For the dates please see the daily newspapers and the waste collection calendar.

**Important information:**  
Used mineral oils, car starter batteries and batteries are to be returned to the points of sale.



**Correct disposal:**  
Residual waste bins. As a rule emptied every 2 weeks. Please see the waste collection calendar for the dates.
